MCA Introduction and Scene Setting

Members discussed their ambitions for the Business Advisory Board and the region, noting the importance of team building, developing links with other bodies and methods of engagement to ensuring clarity of purpose and a strong direction of travel for the Board's work.

2 Economic update and Plan for Growth Evidence Base

The Board received an Economic Update presentation. It noted that nationally:

- Business investment had started to fall, and there was a need to encourage greater private sector investment,
- The UK was less productive than other countries, and without EU funding productivity had decreased.

Specifically in South Yorkshire, it was discussed how investment in transport, housing and infrastructure could benefit and spread innovation across the whole region.

3 Financing Growth and Levelling Up Missions

A discussion was held on the upcoming Autumn Statement and the MCA working towards closer working with Government on the issues South Yorkshire is facing; this includes ambitions to coordinate regional assets, secure greater local financing, and distribute funding proportionally across the region.

Key aspects of financing growth were identified as:

- Driving business productivity,
- Existing collaboration with the Universities and further opportunities to do so,
- Prompting shared messages and ways of working, in line with the mayor's ambitions for the region and a narrative for South Yorkshire,
- Seeking consistent sources of funding.

Communicating a plan for growth which also incorporates issues such as healthy life expectancy.
