10 Welcome and Apologies

11 Minutes and Actions of the Previous Meeting

Members approved the minutes of the 19th March meeting.

ACTION: Andy Gates to forward nomination details for the Transport for the North Board to Ken Perritt.

ACTION: Andy Gates to follow up on the recommendation for UK Steel to prepare a briefing for South Yorkshire MPs.

12 BAB Priorities - Member Portfolios

The group discussed the Board's priorities and previously agreed portfolios:

- Place Making
- Communications & Pitch
- Inclusive Growth
- Workforce, Skills & Careers
- Green Economy & Just Transition
- Transport & Active Travel
- Trade & Investment
- Health & Wellbeing

ACTION: Andy Gates to provide introductions between Board Members and lead officers covering portfolio areas.

ACTION: Tom Bousfield to invite Board Members to the September meeting of the Mayor's Economic Advisory Council.

Members considered the potential opportunities created by the integration of Police & Crime Commissioner (PCC) powers into the office of the Mayor.

ACTION: To create a portfolio around crime, safety and security.

ACTION: Police and Crime to be to focus of a future meeting.

13 Reflections and comments on the briefing notes:

The group reviewed the contents of the briefing pack, which included items on:

- Economic Update
- Investment Zone (IZ)
- Local Nature Recovery Strategy
- Plan for Good Growth
- PCC Integration

In response to questions around resourcing the IZ, it was confirmed that there would be recruitment to positions in the MCA and local authorities to support this activity. It was also noted that whereas other area's IZs had focussed on set projects, SYMCA had tested flexibility to be able to use the funding to land any upcoming, promising schemes. Members also discussed how student startups could be encouraged to remain in South Yorkshire.

ACTION: Joseph Quinn to consider including a Business Advisory Board Member on the Investment Zone Board.

ACTION: Louisa Harrison-Walker to share The Resolution Foundation presentation with the Board.

Members also considered the upcoming UK Real Estate Investment and Infrastructure Forum (UKREiiF).

ACTION: Andy Gates to circulate UKREiiF briefing pack to Board Members.

ACTION: Rachel Clark to circulate a list of UKREiiF attendees to Board Members.

The role of culture in driving economic growth: drivers of activity and opportunities for the business community to engage and support.

The Board discussed the link between culture and business, and how the business community could support and enhance the region's cultural sector.

It was noted that the local authorities were all at different stages of development with their cultural strategies but that these should be complementary. The MCA was also working on a Cultural Investment Framework.

South Yorkshire had a number of great assets, but it was felt that there was a need for an overarching regional vision as well as local stories. The right vision would allow us to effectively promote the region as a cultural destination. It was also noted that investing in the cultural sector delivered benefits in areas such as adult social care, mental health and crime reduction.
