HEALTH & SAFETY TRACKING – RIDDOR INCIDENTS

The following are the RIDDOR reportable incidents from 01/01/22 to 31/03/2022

Ref: 26893 – Barnsley Interchange – 27/01/2022

A male who was suspected as having been drinking fell on the stairs outside Citizen Café. He was having chest pains at the time and it is thought that was the cause of him stumbling, as a check of the area showed no defects or hazards to cause him to fall. Café staff called an ambulance and the man was taken to the local hospital.

Ref: 26928 – Sheffield Interchange – 06/03/2022

An elderly gentleman, who appeared to have fallen, was found by a member of cleaning staff. Whilst he had no apparent injuries he was weak and disorientated and was wearing a hospital wrist band. An ambulance was called and after examination he was taken to the local hospital. A thorough check of the area where he was found was made and there were no apparent defects or anything that could have caused the gentleman to fall.

Ref: 26923 – Rotherham Interchange – 08/03/2022

An elderly female tripped up the kerb whilst crossing the runway, resulting in a nasty gash to her right lower leg. First Aid was administered by staff on site and an ambulance called. Upon examination by ambulance staff the lady was taken to the local hospital. The area where she fell was examined but no defects could be found. It is thought that she tripped in her hastiness to get to the bus.

A young boy trapped his fingers in the edges of the lift doors. He was leaning face front on the doors as they opened and kept his hands on the doors – due to this his fingers went into the small opening where the doors open into. This is not possible with an adult hand, due to the built-in safety mechanism, but due to the small size of his fingers they were bruised. His mother took him straight to the local hospital.

Additional signage has been ordered asking that children are not allowed to lean on the lift doors.
