- 1.1 The South Yorkshire Digital Infrastructure Strategy was approved by the Mayoral Combined Authority on the 20<sup>th</sup> September 2021, and the Delivery Plan setting out the actions to deliver the Strategy was approved by the Housing and Infrastructure Board on the 15<sup>th</sup> March 2022.
- 1.2 Partnership work has been ongoing throughout this year by SYMCA and Local Authorities, particularly with the support of the Superfast South Yorkshire digital team, to implement the actions set out in the Delivery Plan.
- 1.3 This report provides an update of progress in delivering the key early deliverable actions.
