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Executive Summary

South Yorkshire Passenger Transport Executive (SYPTE) is being legally dissolved with effect from 31st March 2023 and the powers and functions vested in the Mayoral Combined Authority (SYMCA). This has resulted in the SYMCA Constitution needing to be reviewed and updated to reflect the dissolution.

What does this mean for businesses, people and places in South Yorkshire?

SYMCA will take over the functions of SYPTE with effect from 1st April 2023

Recommendations

That the MCA approve the amendments to the Constitution with effect from 1st April 2023 to reflect the dissolution of SYPTE, such amendments as set out in track changes to the Appended version of the Constitution.

1. Background

- 1.1 As Members will be aware the formal dissolution of SYPTE is expected at the end of the financial year 2022/23. This requires a Statutory Instrument (SI) to be passed by Parliament, the SI was laid on 8th November 2022 and has been approved by both Houses of Parliament and now just requires signing into law by the Secretary of State.
- 1.2 On the dissolution of SYPTE the Constitution of SYMCA needs to be amended to reflect the change. The Appended version of the constitution sets out the required changes in track change.
