The risk

- New corporate risk added last round: due to SYMCA's capacity and capability in the analysis and insight space, there is a risk that we are unable to gain proportionate and effective strategic insights to inform policy decisions and develop business cases or bids.
- We are developing a plan to address this. Our Director of Insight will bring a paper to November ASRC.

Addressing the risk

- Hire of new Director of Insight on secondment from civil service.
- Work programme in development, which is reducing the residual risk score.
- Three elements of this already in train:
 - 1. A work programme to further business case quality across SYMCA and our LAs, including working with MHCLG and HM Treasury (more info in Annex).
 - 2. Working across SYMCA, LAs and partners such as South Yorkshire Police to explore how we can further develop an insight-led, collaborative approach to evidence and bid development across our organisations and priorities.
 - 3. Identifying what SYMCA's insight function will need to look like under single settlement.
